Description Outcomes for rheumatoid arthritis (RA) have improved as a result of earlier use of, and a wider array of, disease-modifying anti-rheumatoid medications (DMARDs). However, some vulnerable populationsdefined by race/ethnicity, language, literacy, and socioeconomic statushave lagged in the use of DMARDs and in improvement of outcomes.
