## Findings From the 2023 Nursing Home Survey Database





### Overall Results

Average percent positive score across 12 composite measures of patient safety culture



#### Highest Scoring Composite Measure:

##### Feedback and Communication About Incidents



**83%**

reported that staff "always" or "most of the time" discuss ways to keep residents safe, tell someone if they see something that might harm a resident, and talk about ways to keep incidents from happening again.

#### Lowest Scoring Composite Measure:

##### Staffing




**39%**

reported they "strongly agree" or "agree" there are enough staff to handle the workload, meet residents' needs during shift changes, and keep residents safe, because there is not much staff turnover.

### Shift worked most often







## Willingness To Recommend
